Notes	<p>Formerly <i>Viburnum trilobum</i> 'Hahs'</p> <p>From Classic Viburnums: "From a historical standpoint, in the early 1900's, A.E. Morgan undertook a study of <i>V. trilobum</i> in an effort to improve the species. Seed was collected from plants in the northern tier of states in the United States and from Canada. 3300 plants were assembled in a plantatation in the Berkshire Mountains, Massachusetts in 1915 for evaluation. In 1921 the study was taken over by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In 1922 three of the best selections were released to the trade. They were named 'Andrews', 'Hahs', and 'Wentworth'.
