	taken over by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In 1922 three of the best selections were released to the trade. They were named 'Andrews', 'Hahs', and 'Wentworth'. Unfortunately the plantation was
	abandoned 10 years later and destroyed by 1960 to make way for the Massachusetts Turnpike."
