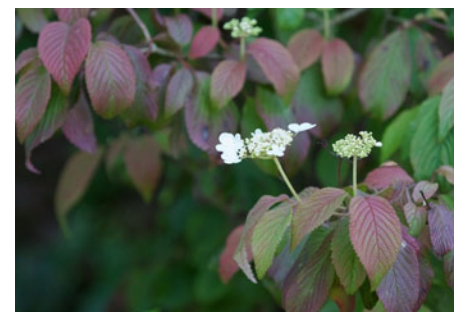

Notes	<p>Classic Viburnums: "A very fine form similar to <i>V. plicatum</i> f. <i>tomentosum</i> 'Mariesii' but somewhat larger and with larger ray (sterile) flowers. Branches are produced in tiered layers but not quite as horizontal as 'Mariesii'. Blooms late spring with showy heads of creamy-white fertile flowers surrounded by large ray florets up to 2" like a lacecap hydrangea. Fruit and fall color are red.
